Initiated in 1958, National Library Week has become a nationwide celebration of libraries and the essential role that they play in the enrichment of people's lives. Patrons turn to libraries in their quest for knowledge, to grow and to achieve their dreams. Librarians offer expert guidance to assist users to expand their worlds and to enter new realms of creativity.

The Glenview Public Library offers a wealth of unlimited possibilities to its patrons every day. Here are just a few that you may want to check out:

Treat yourself to one of the many **Adult Enrichment Programs** offered year-round: concerts, special lectures and culinary events—diverse topics to appeal to a wide variety of interests.

- Learn more about your "Family Tree" utilizing the resources available in the **Genealogy & Local History Room.** Rare documents and books on Glenview's history and early settlers to the region, access to genealogy databases, such as **Ancestry.com** and archival holdings on microfilm and microfiche are all available to enable your search.
- Combine early literacy, family engagement and physical activity by taking your child on a **StoryWalk**. Developed in partnership with the Glenview Park District, the **StoryWalk** displays the pages from a carefully selected children's storybook along a path in Little Bear Garden in The Glen. This is a great interactive activity for parents to enjoy with their youngsters!
- Don't feel like leaving the comfort of your home because the weather is challenging? The Library is at your fingertips anywhere, anytime via the **Library's new mobile App**, **MyMediaMall** (downloadable eBooks and eAudiobooks), Zinio (downloadable magazines), and a wide selection of electronic databases. Your library card is the "key" that unlocks the door to these valuable online resources.

For the visually or hearing impaired patron, a multitude of assistive devices, including a state-of-the-art Merlin HD Video Magnifier, an ADA compatible Computer Workstation, a TTY machine, and a Large Print collection of fiction and nonfiction materials, are available free of charge for use at the Library.




